Dress Definitions;

C – Casual, comfortable, but professional and appropriate for the weather or venue, no open toe shoes at the range please.

BC – Business Casual;

- For women: A reasonable length skirt or trousers of a non-jeans material combined with a top (such as a dress shirt, polo, or sweater set) is considered acceptable. An informal dress with appropriate skirt length is also acceptable.
- For men: A combination of collared shirt (such as a dress shirt or polo shirt), cotton trousers (such as khakis or blue, green, brown, or black trousers) with a belt, and modest shoes with socks is generally acceptable. A blazer or business jacket can optionally be added.

BF – Business Formal, includes business suits, dress shirts, and ties for men. It includes business-oriented suits for women, both skirted suits and tailored pantsuits. Leather shoes (closed-toe/closed heel), socks, and/or hosiery. For female guests a cocktail dress or formal gown with appropriate shoes and hosiery is appropriate.

Please follow to dress codes listed appropriately to give respect to the presenters, guests, dignitaries, and other instructors. Remember photos will be taken and possible news camera coverage.
